



What size housing unit will I receive? Our basic housing policy guidelines state, “the size of housing unit you will receive will depend on your FEMA family composition data.” Please remember, we base our decision on the right size to meet the emergency need based on temporary, emergency housing needs.

Criteria for assigning the size of housing unit are as follows:

Those who would be eligible for a Park Model unit, one bedroom with two living quarters which consist of one full-size bed and one pull-out, full-size couch if they are:

- Single person, a single parent with one child.
- Single parent with two children of the same sex, regardless of age.
- A couple with one child.
- A couple with two children of the same gender regardless of age.

Those who would be eligible for a two-bedroom cottage, which consists of one full-size bed, one twin bed and one pull-out, full-size couch if they are:

- Single parent with two children of the opposite sex over the age of six.
- Single parent with three children regardless of age.
- A couple with two children of the opposite sex over the age of six.
- A couple with three children regardless of age.

Those who would be eligible for a three-bedroom cottage, which consists of one full-size bed, two twin beds, and one pull-out, full-size couch if they are:

- Single parent with four or more children regardless of age.
- A couple with four or more children regardless of age.

If you have needs that are covered by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), you will be asked to complete a couple of ADA forms and have your doctor certify the forms to turn into the Housing Advisor assigned to your case. After receiving the ADA forms, your Housing Advisor will complete an, “Issue Form” requesting the ADA housing unit, attach it to your ADA forms, and submit the entire package for review. All approved ADA applicants will be sized to a two or three bedroom based on family composition. Park Models are not ADA compliant.

If there are unusual circumstances that may warrant a change in the type of housing unit you have originally been assigned, the Housing Advisor assigned to your case will do an interview with you and submit a, “Request for Review” to their supervisor, accompanied by documentation justifying your need for a different housing unit. You will be notified of the results of the review.

Please remember that you must also meet site and jurisdictional requirements before you receive a unit.
